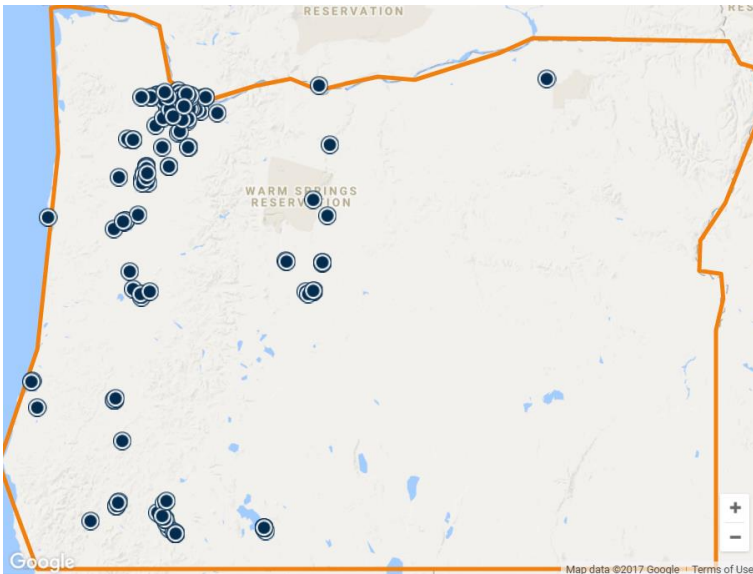

Progress to date

Established monthly Payer Group meetings with consistent membership and attendance (began May 2017)

Created a Steering Committee that meets in between Payer Group monthly meetings and provides input on agenda items and other relevant topics

Engaged with CMS, Milbank Memorial Fund, OHSU Practice Technical Assistance (TA) team and others

Worked with the practice TA team at OHSU to identify ways payers can augment and align with the OHSU-led technical assistance activities to provide additional or complementary support to practices

Drafted and submitted a letter to OHA regarding the rulemaking process for SB 934, which had particular impact on CPC+ payers.

Reached agreement on shared code sets for Track 2 payment methodologies, as well as knowledge sharing and learning around general approaches to Track 2.

Explored a data aggregation solution through convener information gathering and presentations from key potential partners, including OHA, Q Corp/HealthInsight and practices.

Data Aggregation

Invited CMS to share their expectations based on payer MOU

Gathered practice feedback at in-person learning session and through practice presentations

Presentations from existing data aggregation solutions – Oregon Health Authority and Q Corp Data Collaborative

Explored national resources – Data Sharing Requirements Initiative white paper

Payer Group Next Steps

Reach a decision about a data aggregation

- Preference for exploring how to leverage existing solutions; phased approach
- Continue to consider how to streamline the delivery of cost, utilization and quality data for practices

Continue tracking and seeking alignment with other initiatives

- Primary Care Payment Reform Collaborative, the Health Plan Quality Metrics Committee and Metrics and Scoring

Determine the convening work and contract for 2018-2019 and beyond
