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### Tracking Our Progress

Our 2018 goals were successfully met for integrating PDMP data into prescriber and pharmacist health IT systems.

By the end of December 2018, a total of 3,666 prescribers and 2 pharmacy chains (representing more than 240 pharmacists) could access PDMP data within their daily electronic workflows. More than 12,000 prescribers across 74 health care entities had started the process. [See full report](#)
